We also have an extra-curricular programme for JQA students, featuring Art, Music, Drama, PE and Well-Being activities.


News

Respect: CORE Leaders of Tomorrow

'The Leaders of Tomorrow' programme, launched by CORE Education Trust, goes from strength to strength, with JQA students – this week – spending an hour with leadership expert, Jude Jennison. Jude talked to students about her incredibly successful career at IBM, shortly followed by great success as an author and starting up her own business, which provides workshops for leaders and leadership teams – in the company of horses (yes, you read that right!).

During the session, Jude gave students helpful hints on self-confidence, stating, "Sometimes, it's about being gutsy." This continued with an exploration of the word 'no'. Jude explained that this expression was a: 'No, not now' rather than per-

manent rejection. She explored times in her life when things hadn't gone her way and that these were actually opportunities for progression in other directions. One of the most significant points of the session related to forming relationships with peers and working together to solve problems or to seek out for advice. She said, "Find allies; find people who can lift you up and support you."

Teachers who experienced the session were so stunned and elevated by the hour that they have asked to visit Jude's stables in Warwickshire. Students, too, felt that they would like to hear more from her. JQA can't wait to work with Jude on other projects in the near future.

Excellence: Live Lessons

We have now had five weeks of the remote learning timetable – that is 75 live lessons! In that time, students have been engaging with their teachers and participating in lessons almost as if they were in the classroom. We have been delivering the curriculum as normal and student feedback has been excellent. We will be continuing with the live lessons for the final two weeks of term.

As you know, we have also been having virtual tutor times every morning and this has been an invaluable experience for our students; they have been able to engage with their peers and their tutor – discussing their welfare needs and current affairs. It is important to try and have a sense of belonging, being and normality in these extraordinary times.

Here are some examples of the great work that our students have been doing at home:



Florida in Year 10 (above) produced a fantastic response in Textiles to artist, Grayson Perry.

Morgan in Year 8 turned in this excellent response to a Do Now activity as part of her Drama assignments.

1. What is the 'Magic If'

The magic if is a technique used by actors use to feel the emotional response of their characters. For example, an actress is playing a role of a teenage girl who frequently runs away due to difficulties at home- to be able to get into character in more depth the actress would ask her self "WHAT IF i was in that situation"

2. What information can the given circumstance tell us?

A given circumstance would provide us with information on a character's background or their life story. Lucy(a seven year old girl who's body is developing more than it should is trapped with a body of a 14 year old and a mature mind-set.) that sentence there provided us with the information that Lucy is having struggles with her body in life ad feels trapped in someone else's body.

3. How is emotional Memory used?

Emotional memory is used by actors to display a range of emotion. Let's pretend I'm an actress and I need to show that I'm furious. In this scene I would think back to a time in my life where I felt the emotion I'm supposed to portray, in this case I have to show anger so I'd most likely think back to a breakup, or finding out one of my friends weren't who they said they was.

4. Why is stereotyping not naturalistic?

Stereotyping is putting a certain group of people into different categories, which means they set a tone for certain age groups or backgrounds, a common stereotype is a granny struggling to walk Hunched back and walking stick when in reality not all grannies are like that, the stereotypical grannies are the ones we expect to see in a performance.

5. What is an Objective

An objective is thing the actors want to achieve by the end of their rehearsal or performance.

6. What is an Obstacle?

An obstacle is a thing stopping the actors from completing their objectives.

Eternal Life	 This <u>represents Easter</u> eggs being given as a symbol as new life and when the are broken open, they can be seen as Jesus' tomb are opening up. Significant as it <u>represent</u> Jesus resurrection, new birth. They celebrate by send Easter cards which have a picture linked to Jesus resurrection.
SON OF GOD	 The image symbolises Jesus being truthful about his death and resurrection so far. It's is significant as Jesus being resurrection proves that he is the son of god.
	 They celebrate this with Easter as a general with there family.

EXTRA ACTIVITY. The Paschal Candle is lit during the Easter Vigil and symbolises the light of Christ banishing darkness and death.

It is lit everyday through the Ascension Day. The Greek letter alpha and omega signify that God is the beginning and the end. The current year represents God in the present amidst the congregation. Five grains of incense are embedded in the candle during the Vigil to represent the five wounds of Jesus. Farhiya in Year 9 showed her excellent knowledge in RE with these responses in her assignment—and also completed the 'Extra Activity' well done!
