It will be a memorable day and pictures will be in the next newsletter.










OPPORTUNITY- Winter Show

OPPORTUNITY- 9th January 2024

Students will return back on Tuesday 9th of January 2024. The day will be a student training day, in which students will have the chance to start fresh and revisit the school expectations through our CORE values. This will be for Year 7 to Year 10.

The first session will be an assembly and then each other session will look at the values of Collaboration, Opportunity, Respect and Excellence.

Every term, the Form Tutors will assess the students on their character traits. These are our CORE values, with each value having 3 traits (12 traits in total). Form Tutors will rate them using Green, Amber or Red. If the student receives all green in the 12 traits, they will receive a CORE 24 carat badge.

Students will go through their character data during the Opportunity session. They will use their student planner to write down their strengths and what they need to work on.

Year 11 students will have the opportunity to work on any coursework and/or exam questions with their GCSE option subjects.

RESPECT- Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day gives us a chance to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. Remembrance Day is observed on 11 November to recall the end of First World War hostilities. Hostilities formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month" of 1918.

As part of the Jewellery Quarter Academy tradition, our CCF students went to Warstone Lane to lead the community events. Students recited poems, read the names of the fallen and explored the "Shared Remembrance" poppy tapestry.











RESPECT- International Day of Persons with Disabilities

Saturday 3rd December was International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) 2022. International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) is a UN day that is celebrated every year on 3 December.

The day is about promoting the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities at every level of society and development, and to raise awareness of the situation of persons with disabilities in all aspects of political, social, economic, and cultural life. WHO joins the UN in observing this day each year, reinforcing the importance of securing the rights of people with disabilities, so they can participate fully, equally and effectively in society with others, and face no barriers in all aspects of their lives.

Students had the opportunity to learn about the history of IDPD and to demonstrate respect and empathy for people with disabilities around the world.

Only 5% of people with disabilities use a wheelchair Only 20% of disabilities are congenital




RESPECT- Anti-Bullying events

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event held in the third week in November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. Anti-Bullying Week is organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA) in England, which is made up of about 140 member organizations.

Jewellery Quarter Academy takes all different types of bullying very seriously. We promote our SHARP system, which allows young people to report any incidents including bullying anonymously and without fear.

We also promoted anti-bullying week with an assembly for all our year groups. This was conducted by our Deputy Headteacher, Miss Chudusama.

Odd Socks Day is a national event all about celebrating what makes someone unique. It's organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which is a group of organisations, charities and individuals who work together to try and stop bullying. Many of our staff and students wore odd socks in promoting anti-bullying week.

Excellence is expected here at JQA, and that is what they deliver. We look forward to them reporting back in February the impact of their actions so far this year.










EXCELLENCE AT JQA-Mathletes
