COLLABORATION—Attendance Matters

Attendance

All students are expected to arrive on time by 8.35am and attend school every single day.

We do not accept poor attendance, as students who are not at school are missing out on vital learning opportunities. If your child is ill, you should call our Absence Line on 0121 729 7220 and press Option 1. **Illness is treated as absence.**

If your child is classed as 'persistently absent' (if their attendance drops below 90%) you can expect measures to be put in place to support you as a family to make sure your child's attendance improves. We work in partnership with the Local Authority's legal team and will not hesi-

tate to take action should your child's attendance not improve to our expected standards of 97%.

Punctuality

There are a small minority of students who are regularly late for school.

We provide a FREE breakfast between 8.15-8.30 as well as sports equipment to use and books for students to read.

Mr Bibb, Assistant Headteacher, is our lead on Attendance and works closely with families with our Attendance Officer.

Well done to 8CWI for winning Sports Day!












OPPORTUNITY— Opportunity Day

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


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OPPORTUNITY—CORE Extra




RESPECT— World Mental Health Day

We celebrate our diversity at Jewellery Quarter Academy and are proud to welcome people of all faiths and backgrounds to our Academy.






EXCELLENCE AT JQA—Cohort 22 Celebrations
