COLLABORATION— Attendance Matters

Attendance

All students are expected to arrive on time by 8.35am and attend school every single day.

We do not accept poor attendance, as students who are not at school are missing out on vital learning opportunities. If your child is ill, you should call our Absence Line on 0121 729 7220 and press Option 1. Illness is treated as absence.

If your child is classed as 'persistently absent' (if their attendance drops below 90%) you can expect measures to be put in place to support you as a family to make sure your child's attendance improves.

We work in partnership with the Local Authority's legal team and will not hesitate to take action should your child's attendance not improve to our expected standards of 97%.

Well done to Ranya Alsaye (Year 7) and family for winning the Tesco voucher which we award to one of our respondents.






OPPORTUNITY— Opportunity Day 1

OPPORTUNITY—CORE Extra Spring Term



OPPORTUNITY— Royal Birmingham Conservatoire

As part of our partnership with the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire, JQA offers free peripatetic music lessons to 60 students every week in the following disciplines: Piano, Drums, Guitar, Vocals and Music Technology.

This scheme, better known as 'Musicians in Residence', involves music tutors visiting the school each week to provide our students with expert music education in their chosen discipline. These lessons have ignited students with a passion for music as they are being taught how to become industry professionals, whether as a performer or a creator.

Our partnership has been crucial in immersing our students into the music industry, striking up new hobbies and cultivating professional and personal skills. We cannot stress enough how beneficial this opportunity is for our gems.





OPPORTUNITY— Birchfield Harriers Partnership

As part of our ongoing elite external partnerships across Birmingham, we are happy to now collaborate with Birchfield Harriers.

Birchfield Harriers is an athletics club, founded in 1877. Its home is at Birmingham's Alexander Stadium.

As well as welcoming recreational runners they cater for all levels of experience up to and including Olympic athletes whether able-bodied or wheelchair-using athletes.

The Club's motto is Fleet and Free.

Birchfield Harriers have offered Jewellery Quarter Academy a 1 hour session each week for 15-20 students and want more of our students into their club as they serahc for future Olympic gold-medallists.


OPPORTUNITY— French Trip to London

OPPORTUNITY— Returning on Weds 4th January

Students will return back on Wednesday 4th January 2023. The day will be a student training day, in which students will have the chance to start fresh and revisit the school expectations through our CORE values.

The first session will be an assembly by Mr Barton and then each other sessions will look at the values of Collaboration, Opportunity, Respect and Excellence in practice - with rehearsal and routine key features.

Every term, the Form Tutors will assess the students on their character traits. <u>These are our CORE values</u>, with each value having 3 traits (12 traits in total). Form Tutors will rate them using Green, Amber or Red. If the student receives all green in the 12 traits, they will receive a CORE 24 carat badge. You can find out more here.

Students will go through their Character Data during the Opportunity session. They will use their student planner to write down their strengths and what they need to work on.

RESPECT— Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day gives us a chance to honour armed forces members who have died in the line of duty. Remembrance Day is observed on 11 November to recall the end of First World War hostilities. Hostilities formally ended "at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month" of 1918.

As part of the Jewellery Quarter Academy tradition, our CCF students went to Warstone Lane to lead the community events. Students recited poems, read the names of the fallen and explored the "Shared Remembrance" poppy tapestry.











RESPECT— Road Safety week

Road Safety Week runs from November 14th to November 20th. The week, organised by 'Brake', a road safety charity, is an annual event and the biggest road safety awareness event in the UK. The theme of Road Safety Week 2022 is SAFE ROADS FOR ALL, bringing together communities and professionals to shout out for everyone's right to make safe and healthy journeys on safe roads.

Assemblies delivered by Mr Condley focused on highlighting the dangers that students might encounter on the roads, accident hotspots in the JQ community and helpful tips for how students can do their best to limit the risks and keep themselves safe when travelling in our community.





RESPECT— International Day of Persons with Disabilities

Saturday 3rd December was International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) 2022.

The day is about promoting the rights and well-being of persons with disabilities at every level of society and development, and to raise awareness of the situation of persons with disabilities in all aspects of political, social, economic, and cultural life. WHO joins the UN in observing this day each year, reinforcing the importance of securing the rights of people with disabilities, so they can participate fully, equally and effectively in society with others, and face no barriers in all aspects of their lives.

Students had the opportunity to learn about the history of IDPD and to demonstrate respect and empathy for people with disabilities around the world.

 A disability is something which has a serious and lasting effect on a person's ability to do everyday tasks like looking after themselves or doing a job of work.

RESPECT— Free Breakfast Provision

Breakfast is the most important meal of the day. Probably the most appealing benefit is that breakfast **jumpstarts your metabolism** and, thus, helps you burn more calories throughout the day. When you eat breakfast you're telling your body that there are plenty of calories to be had for the day.

Various studies have found different benefits of starting your day with breakfast, including:

- Meeting recommendations for fruit and vegetable consumption
- Having higher daily calcium intake
- Having higher daily fibre intake
- Having better performance (memory and attention) (for school-aged children)

Every morning between 8:15am and 8:30am, students are able to get free toast and juice. Our catering team, Mellors catering, are more than welcoming for students to get a free breakfast and start their day in a positive way.






RESPECT— Anti-Bullying Awareness

Anti-Bullying Week is an annual UK event held in the third week in November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. Anti-Bullying Week is organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA) in England, which is made up of about 140 member organizations.

Jewellery Quarter Academy takes all different types of bullying very seriously. We promote our SHARP system, which allows young people to report any incidents including bullying anonymously and without fear. The Sharp System can be accessed via our website and app.

We also promoted anti-bullying week with an assembly for all our year groups. This was conducted by our Assistant Headteacher, Mr Bibb.

Odd Socks Day is a national event all about celebrating what makes someone unique. It's organised by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which is a group of organisations, charities and individuals who work together to try and stop bullying. Many of our staff and students wore odd socks in promoting anti-bullying week.








RESPECT— The STEP System

The vast majority of our students follow the Jewellery Quarter Academy behaviour policy and are RRS (Ready, Respect and Safe) within lessons and around the building. However, at times we have a very small number of students who do not adhere to the behaviour policy and break our Code of Conduct.

Students will enter the STEP (Support To Ensure Progress) system if they pass the threshold of 10 breaks of our clear Code of Conduct. Parents will be informed and involved at each step of the process and are expected to support the Academy.

The Pastoral Manager will review conduct data each week and Year Group Co-Ordinators will issue reports and alerts via text and phone at different STEPS and alert parents.



3 Breaks of CoC (or suspension) = Move Forward To Next Step

*A panel of Governors will also be convened if conduct results in more than 15 days of suspension in a term.



RESPECT— Echo Eternal Reflect Competition and Event

Echo Eternal is a project that was originally inspired by British Holocaust survivors testimonies, which was recorded with Natasha Kaplinsky OBE in 2015 and 2016 on behalf of UK Holocaust Memorial Foundation.

The project brings together diverse communities in a collaborative context, using a common focus of Holocaust memorial and genocide awareness. This focus is supported by the creation of civic and artistic alliances between schools with different social and cultural characteristics.

Jewellery Quarter Academy has been part of the Echo Eternal project since 2018. In that time we are now a Beacon School, which promotes the Holocaust education throughout the school.

On 26th January, Jewellery Quarter Academy and other Academies will be taking part in the Echo Eternals Horizon performance. This will showcase students talents in singing, acting and dancing. The performance will be based on a survivor for each school. Jewellery Quarter Academy survivor is Zigi Shipper.

Jewellery Quarter Academy will again have students who will be taking part in the COREUs choir and the Echo Eternal Horizon project and we are proud of Beacon School status.

Echo Eternal is promoting a competition in which students create and submit an individual artistic response to their Echo Eternal learning. The final submission will need to be one of the following criteria: Poetry, Digital, Visual arts or Music. The deadline is Friday 6th January.







RESPECT— Christmas Dinner

Wednesday 14th December and Thursday 15th December was an opportunity for our staff and students to have a Christmas dinner together.


EXCELLENCE AT JQA—Homework

Homework is important as it allows students to develop and hone important skills, such as time management and discipline. These are skills that they will find invaluable in the near future – including higher education and their work career. It also acts as a way for the teacher, as well as the pupil themselves, to realise their current level along with their progress. Homework also helps pupils to consolidate class work. Through this they can ensure full and clear understanding.

At Jewellery Quarter Academy, homework will be set once a week from their teachers and they will write this in their planner. Each subject will set different types of homework tasks, this could be a work-sheet, researching on a new topic or consolidating previous knowledge topics.

Many homework tasks are now being done online through subject based websites, such as MathsWatch. We know that this can be quite difficult if you do not have a device to complete it on at home. <u>Devices can be requested, on loan, through the link we have set up here.</u>

If students are finding it difficult to complete homework at home, we do run homework club every Monday and Thursday after school from 3.10pm-4.10pm.
