RESPECT - Feedback on Remote Learning

Virtual JQA Resumes on Monday 22nd February at 0830

In the first instance, Virtual JQA will continue until at least Friday 5th March as we await an announcement from the Prime Minister about students returning to schools shortly.

Our curriculum will be delivered at home through Microsoft Teams, which can be accessed on many devices including desktops, laptops, tablets, phones and some games consoles.

Students will follow a daily timetable which includes their entire curriculum, so they should attend every lesson. We expect students to spend a minimum of five hours learning each day and this does not include breaks. We expect more from our students in Years 10 and 11.

The lessons are delivered live by your child's regular teacher. The format of the lesson follows the same structure which your child is very much used to. The first half is 'delivery' which can include group work, discussion and questioning and our staff have continued to develop their skills in this during lockdown.

The second half of the lesson is when your child should independently complete their assignment on Teams. During this time, their teacher will 'watch' as they are working, giving them live verbal and written feedback as per our policy.

Students in Years 7 - 10 have four live lessons per day plus form time. After lunch, they should complete any outstanding assignments from that day. It is important that they get into a regular routine of doing this.

Year 11 students will now only have FOUR lessons per day (plus form time), after we have acted on feedback from our Year 11 Student Leadership Team, and we expect them to complete outstanding assignments in their own time and to use their time between 2-3pm for this purpose.

Again, developing a routine is of paramount importance. It is also more important than ever for them to engage with remote learning and keeping in regular contact with their teachers.

We would expect our students to have a quiet and comfortable space in the home to work in, a device to work on and to use regular screen breaks to manage their time.

An important role for parents and carers is to check-in with their child throughout the day.

We will always alert you by text if you child is not in one of our scheduled 'live' lessons.

If you would like any support, please contact the academy and we will do our best to support you and your child while they continue to learn from home.









RESPECT - LGBT + Month at JQA

LGBT+ History Month is a month-long annual celebration of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history, and the history of the gay rights and related civil rights movements. It was founded in 1994 by Missouri high-school history teacher Rodney Wilson.

LGBT+ History Month was initiated in the UK by Schools Out and first took place in February 2005. The event is intended to raise awareness of, and combat prejudice against LGBT people and history. Students at JQA, last year, approached the leadership team with suggestions about how we could do more to promote tolerance for members of this community and since then we have involved students in considering what actions we can take to do this.

On Friday 5th February, our Virtual Tutor Time (VTT), our students had a Respect session on LGBT and to understand of how to be an 'ally' to those who might suffer discrimination due to gender, race and sexuality.

One of the questions from the session was, "How can you be an ally?". Below are the responses from our students, who demonstrated that 'here, we look after one another', part of our value of Respect. We are very proud of our students with their responses—and to be a place where all are welcomed and treated equally.

RESPECT- Holocaust Memorial Day

Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) is a British commemoration day dedicated to the remembrance of those who suffered in the Holocaust under Nazi persecution and in subsequent genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia, and Darfur.

Holocaust Memorial Day is marked every year on 27 January. It is also the date chosen for the International Holocaust Remembrance Day and some other national Holocaust Memorial Days. The day is commemorated by a national event that brings together survivors, their families, celebrities and members of the Royal Family to mark the day.



In addition to the national event, there are numerous smaller memorial events around the country organised by many different organisations, groups and individuals. Each year's HMD has a different theme, decided by the Holocaust Memorial Day Trust, as a focus for commemorative events.

The theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2021 will be "be the light in the darkness" to encourage everyone to reflect on the depths humanity can sink to as well as the ways individuals and communities resisted that darkness to '-"be the light" before, during and after genocide. RESPECT - National Storytelling Week




