



WHAT STUDENTS SAY AT JQA...

Here are some lovely words from two of our Year 11 students, Plamedite and Henok, who discussed the changes at JQA since we went into lockdown and starting the new term in year group 'bubbles':

Catching Up

"Science and Maths have helped by revisiting topics that we were struggling on, making sure that we have mastered the topic. Masterclasses helped us explore more topics than in the curriculum. Online learning really helped, and it allowed me to ask questions if I was stuck. Accelerate lessons has allowed us to fill gaps in our knowledge from our option subjects, catch up with coursework and for practical sessions like cooking, it gives us time to bake."

<u>Safety</u>

"The bubbles have ensured that we are safe and remained in school. The masks, taking temperatures and the availability of hand sanitisers reassures us that the school are taking every measure to keep us protected. If a student is ill, they are immediately sent to reception and not remained in class."

Teaching and Learning

"The students are being mature and working hard within lessons, and this is allowing teachers to teach and help us to catch up. The corridors are a lot calmer too."

What has improved at JQA...

"The building has had a big improvement with facilities and equipment. Nothing is broken and if it is, it's fixed straight away. The support that students get from Year 7 all the way to Year 11 is great. It is good to see how subjects are linked to careers. All teachers are helping us with careers and when we ask, they link us to clubs or experts. My sister has been referred to an athletics club after asking Mr Martin for help."
