OPPORTUNITY - JQA In The News

Following the government's announcement in January 2021 that all exams will be cancelled this summer again, students in Year 11 will be awarded 'centre assessed grades' - decided by staff at JQA, based on a robust range of evidence.

As students are making a return back to school, many of our Year 11 students have been working hard during remote learning as they want to get the best grade possible and get onto their chosen courses in at Post-16 providers such as colleges and sixth-forms.

OPPORTUNITY - Well-Being Sessions

On Wednesday 3rd March and Thursday 4th March, our Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) held an afternoon of online Well-Being sessions to support our students' return to JQA. OPPORTUNITY - Fairtrade Fortnight

Fairtrade Fortnight is from 22nd February to 7th March. Fairtrade is about better prices, decent working conditions, local sustainability, and fair terms of trade for farmers and workers in the developing world.



This is done by requiring companies to pay sustainable prices (which must never fall lower than the market price). Fairtrade tackles the injustices of conventional trade, which traditionally discriminates against the most vulnerable. It enables them to improve their position and have more control over their lives.

Our students learnt how Fairtrade has helped many farmers around the world. The form competition was for students to redesign the Fairtrade logo. Here are the entries below:









































RESPECT – Dangerous Apps and Websites

The internet is a safe, fun and informative place, if used well. However, caution is needed because the Internet can be a dangerous place. It's a place where fraud can happen, for example, a place where people can pretend to be someone they are not in order to trick other people (including children), or a place where people can stumble on something they would rather not see.

We understand that technology has developed at such a pace that it feels like children understand more about it than parents/carers do. This can put children in a vulnerable position, so it is important that as adults we do everything we can to educate and protect them. Luckily, there are organisations to help, such as the **NSPCC** and **CEOP**. They provide a guidance on how to approach e-safety with your children and advice on how to make your home e-safe.

RESPECT - Omegle Warning

Dear Parents / Carers,

We hope that you and your families are keeping safe and well during this challenging period.

Your child has now been completing online learning at home for several weeks and will therefore have had an increased amount of access to the Internet during the current circumstances.

In a recent news story, published by the BBC, it has been brought to our attention that there are increasing concerns about an online chat website called "Omegle".

Omegle 'links up' random people for virtual video and text chats. The site claims to be moderated - but has a reputation for unpredictable and shocking content. Omegle's disclaimer states that users should be 18 or over, but there is no age verification process in place and as a result, children as young as 7 are being able to access this site.

Global child protection groups are increasingly concerned about predators using the site to gather self-generated child sexual abuse material. There have been frequent incidents reported to the police, involving children engaging in sex acts with adults and there has also been an increase in self-generated abuse material elsewhere on the internet. This has been created by predators who have captured and distributed footage from Omegle.

We therefore ask that you are aware of the risks involved in your child's use of the Internet and Social Media sites and remember that Omegle is a site for over 18s and your child should therefore not be using this.

We appreciate that it can be hard to know how to talk to your child about online safety. From setting up parental controls to advice on sexting, online games and video apps. RESPECT- E Safety Week


As part of E-Safety Week at Virtual JQA, our students designed a leaflet and posters to give advice of how to be safer online—this was part of our weekly form competition.

What Students Say At JQA

The Student Parliament members had a virtual meeting last week with Mr Tully to go through points that they wanted to discuss. Below are some of the issues your elected members brought before Parliament:

Year 7:

"We love the praise postcards that are being sent home, as it shows us that the teachers are acknowledging the hard work we are putting into remote learning.

We like when teachers model the answers, so we can see where we are making mistakes, so we don't do it again. We would prefer to see the teacher's face during remote learning."

Year 8:

"We want to make sure that the Academy are doing their bit for the environment by recycling. We want more recycling bins around school and bigger bins."

Year 9:

"We wanted to ask questions about GCSE options; we want to know if certain subjects will be available."

Year 10:

"We shared that we are worried that we may have missed a lot of learning and have some gaps, so we wanted 'Accelerate' sessions and more work set to help us as we move into Year 11. We also want to see extra-curricular programmes at JQA starting up again."

Year 11:

"We asked about mock exams when we return and what is going on with the final exams in the summer and how the grades will be given. We said we liked live feedback during remote learning, so we could see that if we are making mistakes and also it's good knowing if we are on the right track.

We also wanted to discuss organising a prom for end of the year. We will update you on this shortly."

COLLABORATION - Return to JQA

Attendance is mandatory for ALL students next week. When students return next week, their timetable and times of the day will be as they were in Autumn Term, to ensure students are in 'learning zones' in bubbles. Students will be expected to wear a face covering in all indoor spaces, but will be given the opportunity for regular, safe 'mask breaks' and students will be supported to ensure they manage this through our well-delivered personal development sessions.

The arrangements for **Monday 8th March**, which will be a staggered start, are as follows:

- Year 7 Live L4L lessons/assignments from home from 08:30 till 14:00
- Year 8 Live L4L lessons/assignments from home from 08:30 till 14:00
- Year 9 Arrive at JQA between 10:30 -10:45 through Student Entrance on Pope St, leave at 14:55 via Student Entrance.
- Year 10 Arrive at JQA between 08:15 –08:30 through Student Entrance on Pope St, leave at 15:00 via Student Entrance.
- Year 11 Arrive at JQA between 13:00 -13:15 through Student Entrance on Pope St, leave at 15:00 via Seacole Centre (001) exit.

The arrangements for **Tuesday 9th March**, which will be a staggered start, are as follows:

- Year 7 Arrive at JQA between 11:20 11:30 through Main Entrance on Albion St going to Raised Deck, leave at 15:00 via Main Entrance.
- Year 8 Arrive at JQA between 08:45 –09:00 through Student Entrance on Pope St using Football Zone only, leave at 14:55 via Main Entrance.
- Year 9 Arrive at JQA at normal time, between 08:00 08:15, via Student Entrance on Pope St using Football Zone only, leave at 14:55 via Student Entrance.
- Year 10 Arrive at JQA at normal time, between 08:15-08:30, via Student Entrance on Pope St using Hatch/Basketball court, leave at 15:00 via Student Entrance.
- Year 11 Arrive at JQA at normal time, between 08:00-08:30, via Seacole Centre (001) doors, leave at 15:00 through Seacole Centre (001) exit.

From **Wednesday 10th March**, all students will use the same entrance points and times that were in place during the Autumn Term (before the national 'Lockdown').

We would kindly like to remind parents/carers to ensure that they do not congregate in large groups out side the Academy when picking their child up at the end of the day. Please maintain social distancing and safety measures and to respect our neighbours when parking.

COLLABORATION - Getting Ready To Return

After the government announcement on 22nd February, it was stated that all schools will open on the 8th March. As the students have not been at school since 5th January, it is vital that the students get back into a strong routine. This means that students should:

- Have correct uniform and equipment—you can check this online here
- Plan your route to arrive at the correct time
- Have a facemask and /or hand sanitiser

Students' uniform is as follows:

- Navy blazer and tie.
- Navy blue and gold tie.
- Pale blue shirt.
- Mid grey trousers / skirt.
- Black shoes—if you are not sure if it's a shoe, it's not a shoe!

The expected equipment is as follows:

- Practical and professional school bag.
- NO POUCHES.
- Clear pencil case.
- Black and/or blue pens.
- Green pen (for self-assessment).
- Pencil, eraser and sharpener.
- Student planner if you took it home
- Lanyard (and ID badge)

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COLLABORATION - Seacole Testing Centre








COLLABORATION - Vaccine Myths
