COLLABORATION - F2D

A number of Year 8 students worked with F2D, who are a company that work with schools to show students how the design and manufacture industry works.

COLLABORATION - NHS Community Project

A number of our Year 10 students have been selected to become NHS research ambassadors.

The project focuses on our students discovering their own personal development, career choices, indepth knowledge, creative thinking and community outreach.

This is a new approach the NHS have put together regarding Work Experience where the students will become Health Ambassadors for the community, looking great on their CV and Personal Statements.

The idea is that the students interview and research people in the community regarding their experiences within the NHS. This particular project is Maternity Care/early childhood care.

Each student has to complete 5 interviews and then report back to an NHS panel with their findings by producing a presentation. The main aim is to help improve future treatment and resources given to expectant mothers.

Students will also have the opportunity to visit the Birmingham Women's Hospital to have hands on experience of being on the labour wards.

COLLABORATION - Music Workshops

Our collaboration with the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire gives JQA students unique musical opportunities to meet and work with professionals in the industry. Our Year 7 students have recently been discovering the beauty and enjoyment of Spoken Word with poet and drummer, Joe, learning that poetry can be cool. Students got to compose and perform their own "rhymes and poetry" – better known as RAP – learning how to discuss key issues and express emotions via spoken word.

Continuing with this theme, Year 8 students met Birmingham-raised rap and grime artist "C4" last Friday who strives to be different from the rest in the game. Students had a live performance, got to partake in a Q&A learning about his career and personal life, and had the chance to win a signed CD via his rhyming competition.







COLLABORATION - Football Beyond Borders

A number of students from Year 8 have been taking part in Football Beyond Borders (FBB), a project where they work on different sports disciplines and how they would use them in the real world.

A selection of these students were invited to be a part of the Football Beyond Borders annual event, where they had the privilege of hearing stories from Ian Wright, the legendary ex-Arsenal striker.

Birchfield Harriers is an athletics club, founded in 1877. Its home is at Birmingham's Alexander Stadium.
