#### **Parent Survey and Symposium**

Below are some highlights from the recent survey:

# **COLLABORATION - Speak Out Challenge**

The "Speak Out" Challenge is the UK's largest youth speaking competition, delivered by Speakers Trust.

The aim is to empower teenagers from all backgrounds to become strong communicators, raise confidence, improve employability and provide opportunities to connect with one another and the world. They believe these skills are needed more than ever.

Thirty students from Year 10 took part in the "Speak Out" Challenge to help them overcome their shyness, build relationships between students and increase student confidence.

Students are able to take part in the "Speak Out" Challenge competition, in which they will be able to compete in June 2023.

At the end of the session, many of the Year 10 students stated that they enjoyed the day and it helped them to understand the importance of the outcomes, which will contribute to GCSE Speaking and Listening in their forthcoming English exams in Year 11.







# **COLLABORATION - Student Survey**

Every term, we send out a survey to students to give us feedback of how the Academy is doing. We really value their views and their voice and encourage our students to submit their views via our Piota app.

Some particular highlights from the survey are:

- 90% of students would recommend this school to a friend who moved to the area.
- 93% of students say that when bullying occurs, the staff deal with it really well.
- 94.8% of students say that JQA encourages them to look after their emotional and mental health (i.e through tutor time/assemblies).

### OPPORTUNITY— World Book Day

We opened the doors to the library again on World Book Day (2<sup>nd</sup> March 2023), a day that we value so much here at JQA as it gives the students the opportunity to receive a free book. This year we gave out around 80 free books to our students, some of which were kindly donated from The National Literacy Trust, as well as uploading the virtual voucher to our school teams groups to ensure that all students could obtain their free book from bookstores. The day was a great success, as students partook in library treasure hunt games to help them navigate their way around our expanded library shelves and finally got to see and experience the new library.

This term has seen the redevelopment of our lovely JQA library, with an expansion in physical size and pupil capacity, access to laptops, an array of Non-Fiction books to choose from and the most popular of all, four new chess boards kindly donated by Mr Barton himself. Our figures suggest that the expansion of our learning resource space has allowed for more students to take books out, play chess, use laptops for educational purposes and feel comfortable in a safe and friendly environment during their break and lunch times. From the records we keep for library usage, the average amount of students we see come through our new doors is around 70-75 from all cohorts. That is on average 18 students entering the library each break and each lunch time, four times a day.











### **OPPORTUNITY**— Careers Week

National Careers Week ran from Monday 6 March to Saturday 11 March. The aim is to help young people become more aware of career choices and make them excited about their future.

It can also inspire young people to think about what they can achieve and believe they can do anything they put their mind to.

It also opens doors to careers they may not know existed, by talking to eternal visitors about their career journey and teaching staff and what other jobs they may have had before teaching. By getting involved in careers week, the students build confidence and self-belief too.

Many departments ran virtual sessions by external providers to show the importance of careers within the curriculum.

On International Women's day we also had the pleasure of a lady called Kelly that came to discuss her career within the RAF and other roles that the girls at JQA didn't know existed, such as medicine, dentistry and catering.

I believe that it is vital to allow all students to have the opportunities to engage in careers as much as possible throughout their school life, to make them prepared for post 16 as we do at JQA.

### **RESPECT Sessions**

In Respect form time sessions, our students were given a reminder of the high expectations we have of their conduct outside of JQA and in the local Jewellery Quarter community. When our students wear our gold tie they represent the Academy and its CORE values. Excellence is expected here.

Also in form time, our students learned all about acceptable use of social media, and how to stay safe and out of trouble when online. ### Respect and social media use...



This session will focus on how we use social media and how to conduct ourselves in the right, respectful way in our relationships with others

Recently, there have been too many incidents of misuse of social media leading to arguments, upset and conflict between students

This needs to be addressed: Remember, excellence is expected here!

Bullying is the use of force, coercion, hurtful teasing or threat, to abuse, aggressively dominate or intimidate. The behavior is often repeated and habitual.





### **RESPECT Sessions**

In form time, our JQA gems were learning about the origins of Ramadan, and were given helpful advice on how to help and support themselves and each other when fasting.

#### Why do Muslims observe Ramadan?



Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, observed by Muslims worldwide as a month of fasting, prayer, reflection and community.

Ramadan is the 4<sup>th</sup> of the 5 pillars of Islam, basic acts in Islam, considered mandatory by believers, and are the foundation of Muslim life.

This year, Ramadan – the Islamic holy month – falls from around 22<sup>nd</sup> March to April 21st. This marks the time of the revelation of the Qur'an

Muhammad's first revelation was an event described in Islamic tradition as taking place in 610 AD, during which the Islamic prophet, Muhammad was visited by the angel Jibrīl, known as Gabriel in English, who revealed to him the beginnings of what would later become the Qur'an.

Excellence is expected here at JQA, and that is what they deliver. We look forward to them reporting back again in the next edition on some of the impact of their actions so far this year.








### EXCELLENCE AT JQA—100% Attendance Awards
