OPPORTUNITY- Taster session day

Taster sessions, or taster days—also known colloquially as "Try Before You Apply" sessions—are a popular way for higher education institutions to help drive student recruitment in high-priority subject areas as well as offer students an authentic perspective on what studying at your institution would be like.

These taster sessions can play an important role in exposing secondary or high school students to a firsthand university experience before deciding to apply to that higher education institution.

Our Year 10 students were invited to take part in taster sessions at Birmingham Metropolitan College (BMet college) in June. They took part in different activities throughout the day to get a feel of what college/ post-16 life is like.



RESPECT – Windrush Generation

Windrush Day takes place on 22 June, remembering the day when around 500 migrants from the Caribbean arrived at Tilbury Docks in Essex in 1948.

Britain was just starting to recover from World War Two back then. Thousands of buildings had been bombed, lots of houses had been destroyed and it all needed to be rebuilt.

In the Caribbean, lots of young men and women had served in the British armed forces because at the time, many Caribbean countries were still under British rule and not yet independent. After the war, some of these people answered an advert to come to Britain where there were lots of different jobs to do.

They got on a ship - the Empire Windrush - which left the Caribbean to travel thousands of miles across the Atlantic.

This was the first time so many Caribbean people had come to live in Britain. Many more arrived in the following years.

It was 22 June 1948 when the Empire Windrush arrived at Tilbury Docks in Essex.

As part of our Refugee Week, students learnt about the Windrush Generation and the positive impact it had on the British community.











RESPECT- Armed Forces Day

Armed Forces Day takes place on the last Saturday each June, falling next year on 27 June.


It is a chance to show your support for the men and women who make up the Armed Forces community: from currently serving personnel to Service families, veterans and cadets.

RESPECT - Staying safe during the Summer

Summer means longer days, warmer weather, and endless opportunities for outdoor fun. Whether you're heading to the park, enjoying a backyard BBQ, or going on a family walk, this season invites us all to get outside and make memories. But with the fun comes a few important safety considerations to help ensure you stay healthy and injury-free.

From rising temperatures to increased exposure to the elements, here are some essential summer safety tips to help you and your loved ones stay protected while enjoying everything this season has to offer.

Sun Safety

- **Use sunscreen**: SPF 30 or higher, broad-spectrum, and water-resistant. Reapply every 2 hours.
- Wear protective clothing: Lightweight long sleeves, wide-brimmed hats, and UV-blocking sunglasses.
- Avoid peak sun hours: Stay in the shade between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Hydration

- **Drink plenty of water**: Aim for at least 8 glasses a day, more if you're active or sweating.
- Avoid alcohol and caffeine: These can dehydrate you.
- Eat hydrating foods: Watermelon, cucumber, oranges, and strawberries are great choices.

Heat Protection

- Stay cool indoors: Use fans, air conditioning, or cool showers.
- **Limit strenuous activity**: Especially during the hottest parts of the day.
- Know the signs of heat exhaustion: Dizziness, nausea, headache, and heavy sweating.

Bug Safety

- Use insect repellent: Especially in areas with mosquitoes or ticks.
- Wear long sleeves and pants: When hiking or in wooded areas.
- Check for ticks: After spending time outdoors.

Water Safety

- Swim in designated areas: With lifeguards if possible.
- **Never swim alone**: Always have a buddy.
- Watch children closely: Even in shallow water.
