I hope that you are continuing to have a restful break together as a family. We'd like to take this opportunity to remind you that all students are expected to return to school <u>in full uniform for 8.30</u> on Wednesday 4th January 2023. Students' uniform will be inspected upon entry by a senior leader and they are expected to be 'ready' in their blazer, black shoes and gold tie.

Students will be offered a free breakfast on arrival and will be issued with a new timetable by their form tutor who will also check that they have their expected equipment and planner. Our clear uniform and equipment policy is here. I look forward to seeing smartly-dressed students, ready to shine. We also welcome some new staff starting in January: Mr Allen in English, Ms Powell in Science and Sr. Lora in Modern Foreign Languages. I will share more details in my first blog of the new year.

A reminder that students in **Year 7** and **Year 8** have crucial tests beginning in the new year to measure their progress so far; **Year 10** also have their Parents' Evening on Thursday 5th January (4.30-6.30) and appointments can be booked using our booking system here. **Year 9** parents are reminded of our virtual Options Evening via Microsoft Teams on Thursday 19th January. **Year 11** have a crucial term after their first set of mock exams too – with key knowledge to be consolidated, key skills to be practised and all coursework to be completed.
